Atlas of Blackness (AOB) is a grassroots multimedia artistic research-based organization that mentors Black foster youth by providing resources to document their untold stories to produce authentic narratives rooted in their truth.

Kerry Kennedy

Kerry is President of Robert F. Kennedy Human Rights. She is the proud mother of three daughters, Cara, Mariah, and Michaela. A human rights activist and lawyer, she authored New York Times best seller *Being Catholic Now*, as well as *Speak Truth to Power* and *Robert F. Kennedy: Ripples of Hope*. Kerry has received high honors from President Lech Walesa of Poland for aiding the Solidarity movement, The Humanitarian award from the Congress of Nobel Peace Prize Laureates, and many other honors.

Cara Kennedy-Cuomo

Cara Kennedy-Cuomo Board member, Robert F. Kennedy Human Rights and previously an associate at 17 Asset Management, a global firm that designs and manages investments aligned with the 17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.
