Nilab Ahmadi

Nilab is a youth activist and holds a law degree from Kabul University. Since 2015, she has been volunteering with several organizations on social and educational projects, including UN-Women, the UN-75 initiative for Kabul University, Dynamic Youth Afghanistan, and the American Embassy of Afghanistan-funded programs for Lincoln Learning Center. She is currently working with the United Nations World Food Program.

Ahmad Bakdad

Ahmad is a 28 year-old child protection officer with UNICEF in Aleppo, Syria. Trained as a lawyer, he worked for five years in the legal field before realizing he wanted to build a career supporting children and youth, the most severely affected by the war. Ahmad has worked as the National Child-Safeguarding advisor for SOS Syria children's villages as well as with UNDP and Syria trust for development Congress of Nobel Peace Prize Laureates, and many other honors.

Sophia Kopytko

Sophia is a 16 year-old champion in pole sports and has been active in theater since she was a child. This year marks her sixth anniversary as a member of the Theater of Chernivtsi Youth. The theater engages young people aged 6 to 20. During rehearsals and performances kids can forget the word "war" for a moment and dip into art and communication. Chernivtsi, a city in the west of Ukraine, has served as a refuge for many displaced people from cities under siege in the country.

Oleksandra Goldina

Oleksandra, or Sasha, is a 16 year-old with a passion for theater. She has been acting at the Theater of Chernivtsi Youth for the past year and especially loves the idea of spreading Ukrainian history and culture via theater. Being involved with the Theater of Chernivtsi Youth has given her a space to do exactly that. The Theater's main aim during the war is to keep creative development flowing and by helping children find their voices through acting during this hard time.
